This term the focus is on number and counting, ordering and comparing numbers to 20. Addition and subtraction facts, doubling and counting on 1 more/ 1 less.

Science:

In Year 1, we are looking at objects and the material from which it is made.

In R.E., we will be exploring the themes Good News and Christian Community. We will visit Christ Church to meet Chris and the team for a look around and talk about the features. We will learn good news stories that Jesus told.
