Welcome to Apple Class

In Apple Class you will find Miss Jones (EYFS Teacher), Miss Corkin (Higher Level Teaching Assistant), and Mrs Taylor (Teaching Assistant). We welcome you and look forward to learning more about your child and helping them to have a successful year. We believe that when children are happy in their environment they will learn and grow as individuals. A range of fun and interactive activities are provided for your child to experience and enhancements within areas are planned to develop independent learning. Tapestry

Tapestry is our online observation and assessment tool. It allows you to view what your child has been learning about, activities they have been involved in and their independent work. Please could you send photos/comments via Tapestry, so that we can share any achievements and special events that your child has been involved in outside of school. We love to know what they learn at home too!

Reading

Reading books and library books are changed on Thursday. Each child in Reception will read with an adult three times a week at school. We ask that you listen to your child read at home as much as possible. Please make sure reading books and diaries are in school on Thursdays.

PE

Our PE day is Tuesday afternoon, for reception children. Please make sure **named** kits are in school. An outdoor kit would be useful, jogging bottoms and a jumper are ideal so we can get outside when the weather allows.

Forest School

We are lucky enough to have Forest School every week in our fabulous garden. Nursery **. All children nursery and reception** will have Forest School every <u>Wednesday afternoon</u>. Forest School is led by Miss Corkin with Mrs Bott and Mrs Taylor. The children should **come to school** in their Forest School clothes. They will need something that you don't mind getting muddy! Please could children wear long sleeved trousers/ leggings and long sleeved tops, so they are able to climb trees safely. We have waterproofs to put on over the top and children can change into wellies. Please provide your child with a pair of wellies to keep in school. <u>Getting ready for school</u>

<u>Homework</u>

I will collect homework in on a Thursday and add new tasks ready for your child to bring home on a Friday. Our literacy homework is a spelling sheet, with spellings relevant to the English or phonics teaching for that week. There will be a quick 'quiz' on a Friday, so practising at home really helps. Some weeks there may be a game to play on **'ActiveLearn'.** Numeracy homework is an online game – again on **'ActiveLearn'.** We will have a look at the allocated task each Thursday, that way your child will know which homework they have to complete. You can find the games by following the link below and clicking on' my stuff'.

Reading

We read throughout the week with children in guided reading sessions. Your child will read with either Miss Bagshaw, Mrs Barnes or myself and we will change reading books on a Thursday. The children will also bring home a library book to share with you. We aim to change these with fortnightly. Please make sure library books are returned to school so they can be swapped when needed.

<u>P.E.</u>

We have PE on a Tuesday. Please make sure your child comes to school in suitable PE kit on this day. An outdoor kit, jogging bottoms and a jumper are ideal so we can get outside when the weather allows.

Reading

We read throughout the week with children in whole class guided reading sessions. Please make sure library books are returned to school so they can be swapped.

<u>P.E</u>

All children have PE on a Monday. Please make sure your child comes to school in PE kit on this day. Please ensure this is an outdoor kit, jogging bottoms and a jumper are ideal so we can get outside when the weather allows. Unfortunately we don't have room for rucksacks and backpacks on our pegs, so if you could use school book bags that would be super! If you do not have these, we have some in school so please ask us.

Enrichment Afternoon

On a Friday the children will be split into two groups. One group will be outside in Forest School with Miss Corkin and Mrs Harrison– they will need to come to school in their Forest School clothes on that day. The other group will be with OTIS coaches enjoying sport activities for the afternoon– they will need to be in their PE kit on that day. Miss Doherty will let you know which group your child is in asap. The groups will then swap after half term.

OAK CLASS (Year 5 and 6)

Mrs Vitti and Mrs Pickering

Hello Oak Class Families,

I hope you have all had a fantastic summer holiday. We are really looking forward to all of the exciting things we have planned this year!

Homework

Every child at Tintwistle School is expected to complete homework. As your child will be in Oak Class, it is their responsibility to hand it in on time. If they fail to do so, they will have to complete it during 'homework reward time'.

English:

This will be given out on a Thursday and is due back the following Thursday. The homework will be a list of spellings which the children will need to learn, and occasionally, a grammar activity.

Reading:

All children in Oak Class will be expected to read from a fiction chapter book **at least 3 times a week** after school; whether this is with a parent or independently. A reading diary will be sent home for the children to use which will be checked daily. They can also read non-fiction texts, comics, magazines etc for pleasure and can record this in their reading diaries.

Spellings:

To be working at the expected standard in writing at the end of Year 6, children **must** know how to spell and use all of the Year 3/4 words and most of the Year 5/6 Words. If they are not learnt, your child will unfortunately not go to secondary school meeting the National expectations. Children will be tested on these throughout the year and any gaps will be sent home to learn.

Maths: Homework will be given out on a Thursday as well and will be due back the following Thursday. This will be an activity which your child can complete independently based on what we have been learning in school.

Times Tables:

The Government have recently introduced an online times tables test that children must pass with 100%. Now more than ever it is **vital** that children to know them **all**. If there are any times tables your child does not know at this stage – please could they use the holidays to learn them. In year 5 and 6, tables are used in many elements of maths. If they do not know them, they may struggle to keep up.

PE:

PE will be taught every week. Your child will need to come to school wearing their PE kits to school on a Wednesday. This must be a school jumper, dark sports trousers or shorts and a white t shirt. Your child will also be going swimming this year on a Thursday morning. Please make sure that they bring their swimwear (one piece for the girls and shorts above the knee for the boys) a towel and hair tied back. Please ensure earrings are removed and no spray deodorants are used in the changing rooms. We will let you know when swimming lessons start.

Expectations:

As your child is now in Oak Class, they will be setting an example for the whole school. It is important that they;

Arrive to school on time. Are more independent in all things that they do. Wear the correct school uniform. **Do not wear jewellery** and have long hair tied up. Take responsibility for their homework and bring it in on time.

If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to come and talk to any of us before or after school or ask Sue in the office to book you an appointment.
